WHAT: A donation of money is usually more valuable than a donation of food. See reverse for more details and donation types.

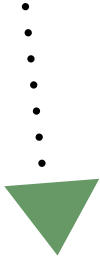

The Food Pantry of Waukesha serves over 5,700 clients each month. The need for help continues and isn't slowing down. The Food Pantry is accepting non-perishable food items, non-food items, and monetary donations.

Helpful hints for your donation.....

A ***donation of money is usually more valuable*** than a donation of food.

- Money gives the food pantry the purchasing power to buy products in bulk at bulk discount prices. They can also purchase what is needed to provide a balanced, nutritional package to the families they serve. (Please send a check made payable to "**Food Pantry of Waukesha County**," to Dave Rebro at 3212 Woodridge Lane. No cash will be accepted.)

Items that the food pantry welcomes as donations include:

- meals in a can, such as stews and ravioli
- canned soups
- canned tuna or other canned meat
- peanut butter
- pasta, pasta sauces
- canned fruit
- macaroni and cheese mix
- disposable diapers and baby formula
- hygiene products – soap, shampoo, tooth paste, tooth brushes, dental floss, deodorant
